

Benjamin Ohene Asare Bediako was born on 26th July, 1942 at Wassa Simpa to Elder John Kofi Kona and Mary Kwaah, both of blessed memory (they lived 107 and 87 years respectfully).

EDUCATION

Benjamin started his early childhood education at Simpa D/A Primary School. From 1967, he schooled at Nkoranza College of Education and completed in 1971 with Teacher's certificate "A"

WORK EXPERIENCE

He started teaching at Samreboi after his training as a professional teacher and later transferred to Sekondi/Takoradi metropolis. He taught in many schools and headed a handful of them. Having rose through the various ranks in the Ghana Education Service, retired as an Assistant Director in 2006.

Bediako taught for 38 years. While in the service, the Sekondi/Takoradi Metropolitan Educational Director mandated him to organize in-service training for some teachers and also supervise them to earn their promotions.

CONVERSION

Although Benjamin was born into the Church of Pentecost, he accepted Christ as his Lord and personal saviour in 1960 and was baptized by immersion in the same year by Pastor Opoku Ahwennie of Blessed memory at Wassa Simpa. He received the Holy Ghost Baptism in 1961.

Elder Benjamin Ohene Asare was born into the Church of Pentecost but he accepted Christ as his Lord and personal saviour in 1960 and was baptized by immersion in the same year by Pastor Opoku Ahwennie of blessed memory at Wassa Simpa. He received the Holy Ghost Baptism in 1961.

While in Sekondi, he worshipped with the Church of Pentecost the then old palladium. Later, Elder Benjamin joined the new Site assembly, ordained a deacon in 1972 and as an Elder in 1977 by Apostle Abraham Tetteh Nartey of blessed memory.

Elder Benjamin Ohene Asare served the church in various capacities as District Secretary (Takoradi District for 11 years and Effiakuma District for 4 years), presiding eldership (New Site Assembly 8 years, Tanokrom Assembly 8 years, West Ridge 14 months, Anaji Town Assembly 27 months and Mampong Assembly 5 months),

Sunday School, Teacher (Takoradi District 14 years), District PEMEM Leader (Anaji Estate District 4 years), District Ministerial Committee Membership (Takoradi District 11 years, Effiakuma District 4 years and Anaji Estate District 4 years) and Area PENTSOS Chairman 6 years.

Benjamin was known to be very zealous and affable. His interpersonal relations was commended by all who were privileged to have had an encounter with him. He was receptive to all, selfless and content with whatever he has. Elder Benjamin was a great teacher of the word, always studying the scriptures to discover profound truths in order to feed his audience with insightful and life transforming message.

Elder Ohene Asare Bediako was also known to be a man of prayer. His prayer life was exemplary, and in every District he served, he mentored and built up the spiritual lives of the members entrusted to his care. Today, this great personality has fallen, and indeed, Anaji Estate District has lost a father, a mentor and a motivator. When he suffered minor illness, we never knew that he would be called home by his maker.

His sudden passing in the early hours of Friday January 28, 2022, came as a shock to all of us. But what can we say!!!!! Since it is God who gives and takes away.
