Prince Albert Fiifi De-Man was born at Adiembra in Sekondi on Friday 1st July 1955 to Mr Yaro De-Man and Madam Elizabeth Yankah both of blessed memory.

Ras Fii affectionately called by many started his elementary education at Nana Anaisie Memorial School, Adiembra in 1961 and completed in 1971. He creditably passed the then enviable standard seven certificate examination. Ras Fii was employed by ROTHMANS INTERNATIONAL (King Size Cigarettes Factory) Accra from 1976-1978 and resigned. He worked for three years. Later he joined 2Guys Arts and Painting, owned by his elder brother. Ras Fii worked for sometime and left for Nigeria to seek greener pasture, where luck eluded him. He was among the Ghanaians who were repatriated from Nigeria in 1983.

Ras Fii stayed in Adiembra. He did not relent on his oars, and continued his Arts and Painting work, and also joined Hola Soundz as Disc Jockey (D.J.) Being a hardworking gentleman, he combined these two skills until his untimely death.

Being a child of Christian parents, Ras Fii never forgot his God and Church. He became a member of Christian Faith Church in Sekondi, two years ago. Ras Fii was not only a church goer but a Christian to the core.. Yes! He wore dreadlocks. His dreadlocks only symbolizes or represents his connection as pure African and rejection of the West termed Babylon. A renewed sense of pride in black African with their belief in keeping things natural. The Lord looks at the heart of man, 1st Samuel 16:7, Ras Fii lived and practiced his Christianity. Even we had three great leaders in the bible who wore dreadlocks, namely Samuel 1st Samuel 1:11, Solomon Song of Solomon 5:2&11, and Samson Judges 13:5

Ras Fii social life was full of pleasant memories to all friends, relatives and acquaintances. He was simple, unassuming and humble, and sometimes to a fault. He was very loving and affectionate. His humanity and humility were perfectly natural. This was very beautiful and true of Ras Fii.

On Thursday 15th June 2023, God the creator of heaven and earth in the words of ecclesiastes plucked what he planted in 1955. It is very much against the will of humanity. Ras Fii passed on to eternity.

have known Mr De - Man for many years now, It was about twenty years ago that I was called on to break the unpleasant news of fire outbreak that caused a havoc in his brother's house.

The sad incidence happened at Diabenekrom on the 19th of January 2003 where his junior brother, Mr Ebo De-Man got burnt seriously, and their mother died four days later.

The Junior brother, having been hospitalised for over a year due to the burns and who kept on asking of the mother on his sick bed, had to be told the truth of the demise of the mother earlier a year ago. Mr Albert Prince Fiifi

De-Man and a relative approached me to break this news. This was how I became close to Mr Albert Prince Fiifi De-Man and his brother.

Anytime we met we would exchange pleasantries. A good professional Painter he offered to paint my residence with his team at a reduced price. He was very understanding.

Two years ago his beautiful wife who had been indisposed for some time passed on and I had to do the burial service with the Christian faith church International ministers of Sekondi and the whole church.

It was after the burial service that he

accept his rastafarian hair which he had not shaved for over 40 years.

In church he came to kneel down in front of me that he wanted to accept Jesus Christ as his Lord and Saviour. I led him personally to accept Christ. I told him that JESUS CHRIST IS MORE INTERESTED IN HIS HEART AND MIND THAN HIS HAIR

He began attending church services with his daughters. During one Sunday Service he came forward for prayer. It was after this prayer that his hair strangely came off. (Miraculously as if he had been shaved) HE came to church and gave testimony amid great jubilation.
